Biography: A.L. Burt was born in Listowel, Ontario on November 28, 1888 and graduated from the University of Toronto. He studied at Oxford as a Rhodes Scholar. In 1930, after some years as Head of the Department of history at the University of Alberta, he became professor of History at the University of Minnesota. He retired in 1957 as an emeritus and served as a visiting professor at Carleton University, the University of Chicago, and the University of Manitoba. He was president of the Canadian Historical Association and has published many books. He passed away in 1971.

Correspondence pertaining to a photostat copy of Minutes of enquiry in the new Western Settlements, Cornwall (July 25, 1787), Burt 's receipt of a copy of England in the Middle Ages, notes and maps regarding the location of historic forts and trading posts in Canada under the French regime, Burt's request for advice from Morton about accepting the chairman of the Board of Governors of Dalhousie University, a compliment from an American Nazi for Burt's defence of Nazi Germany in a debate with Mme. Branting (a Jewish Marxist), a request for information about the exact reference to the Major Mathews diary of 1787, a manuscript copy of J. Monk's letter of Nov. 17, 1775 re the trouble he has experienced because of his prosecution of certain influential citizens of Halifax, a report on Gerald Brown's research in the Germain: J Papers, an obituary of James Francis Kenney, Burt's comments on Howard's Strange Empire and a number of research questions.
