MG 215 - Beamish / Kenderdine Family fonds

Dates: 1909-1990.

Extent: 52 cm of textual records; 56 photographs; 173 postcards; 1 videotape. See also oversize.

Biography: In 1908 A.F. "Gus" Kenderdine, his wife Jane (née Ormerod) and their children emigrated from England to Saskatchewan, where they homesteaded near Lashburn. Gus Kenderdine became the first `artist-in-residence' at a Canadian university when president Walter Murray hired him in 1920; Kenderdine later became a lecturer in art at the University, and was largely responsible for the formation of the University's Art Camp at Emma Lake (now known as "Kenderdine Campus").

The Kenderdines had four children: Richard, Adelaide, May, and a third daughter, Rose, who died during the influenza epidemic of 1918. Richard eventually took over the family farm near Lashburn. Adelaide (BA '23) married John Kenderdine, a distant relative, and they lived for many years in Japan both before and following World War II. Florence May Kenderdine married Oswald Beamish; they, too, lived near Lashburn. Between 1985-1986 May Beamish donated approximately 130 of her father's paintings and sketches to the University of Saskatchewan, and provided over \$1 million to help fund the new College of Agriculture building on the condition that it include an art gallery.

Custodial History: May Beamish was predeceased by both her parents and her siblings. As the last living member of her immediate family, May was left with documents originally belonging to other family members. Oswald and May Beamish were childless, and when May died these documents became the property of her niece, Adelaide Retzlaff. Ms. Retzlaff donated them to the University of Saskatchewan Archives in 1999.

Arrangement: This fonds contains correspondence, cards, and published materials owned by various members of the Kenderdine / Beamish families. The fonds is organized into 5 series:

- I. Christmas Cards
- II Correspondence
- III. Family
- IV Photographs
- V Published Materials

No attempt has been made to divide the material further by separating documents originally belonging to one family member from another.

Restrictions: There are no restrictions on this collection.

Associated materials can be found in the A.F.L. Kenderdine fonds (MG 87). Materials relating

to Emma Lake and the artists who studied there can be found in the department of Art and Art History fonds (RG 2034); the Ruth Pawson fonds (MG 204); the Beth and McGregor Hone fonds (MG 183); the Hans Dommasch fonds (MG 172); the Mina Forsyth fonds (MG 97); and the Jean Murray fonds (MG 61). III. <u>FAMILY.</u> - 14 cm.

1. Adelaide.

Adelaide Kenderdine and her family spent a number of years in Japan, leaving at the outbreak of the war. In her letters and the writings of others, Adelaide is referred to sometimes as either "sis" or "Diane," at times in fact referring to herself by this latter name. This file includes postcards, some of which have been annotated, Christmas cards, and artworks.

Notes, presumably written by May Beamish, documenting various events in the life of the family and the [sales? gifts?] and exhibits of her father's paintings.

Financial records relating to May and Oswald Beamish's donations to various art galleries, as well as correspondence concerning Kenderdine paintings.

6. **Miscellaneous**. - textual records + 5 photographs.

Includes an Edmonton Exhibition and Stampede pamphlet, 1925; a promotional brochure for "Igloo," nd; "How to Treat a Horse;" a CBC radio script; etc. *The Life of Our Lord* was published serially in the Star Phoenix; Jane Kenderdine compiled the set.

- Postcards. [ca. 1920s-1930s?]. -20 b&w, 3 sepia, 4 colour postcards. Primarily from England and Wales, these were not with the postcards acquired by Gus Kenderdine during his world tour (see below), nor were they annotated in any way.
- 8. Reminiscences. nd, 1954-1987.

Primarily by May Beamish, these include brief articles on her teaching experience, Emma Lake and environs, a trip she and Oswald took to Cuba and Jamaica in 1957, their travels north and to California, etc. It also includes "The Beamish Story" by Ethel Chivers.

9. Short Stories - Edith Butler Tyre.

World Tour - Postcards. - 1935. - 145 postcards; 6 photographs. - 19 folders. From May-August 1935, Gus Kenderdine went on a world tour, visiting Europe, Asia and the Middle East. He collected postcards from these countries, most of which were not annotated and none of which were used for communications home. These cards include photographic depictions of the countries he visited as well as illustrations and/or works of art. See also below, "Publications - The Pacific Empress."

- 10. World Tour Postcards NYK Line "Tatsuta Maru." 3 colour postcards. Cards depicting the liner Kenderdine sailed on.
- 11. World Tour Postcards Egypt. 6 b&w postcards; 1 colour tinted postcard. Images of Cairo; a statue; the pyramids at Ghiza; a woman in typical dress.
- 12. World Tour Postcards Hong Kong and Singapore. 5 b&w postcards. Images of the city; harbour; "chair" transportation.

- World Tour Postcards Italy Capri. 12 colour postcards. From watercolour paintings.
- 14. World Tour Postcards Italy Florence. 4 b&w postcards; 1 colour postcard. Details of artwork or interiors; the Ponte Vecchio.
- 15. World Tour Postcards Italy Naples. 2 colour postcards.
- 16. World Tour Postcards Italy Rome. 20 b&w postcards. Various landmark buildings, plazas, monuments.

- Dry Gully. 1919, 1981. 2 b&w photos; 1 colour photo. Two images of the school, one with children and teacher out front, the second with children in a horse-drawn cart; and one image of the Gully in fall, 1981.
- [Family] Unidentified. 1913-1949. 7 b&w photos.
 Various individuals, some of whom are identified only by their first names; possibly relatives or friends of the Kenderdine / Beamish families.
- 4. **Murray, Jean**. 1922. 1 b&w photo. Jean Murray's graduation photo; signed.
- Saskatoon. [ca. 1922]. 2 b&w photos. Nutana collegiate, and the skyline viewed from across the river; group photo at the Normal School opening, 1922.
- Scenic. nd, 1930. 4 b&w photos. Identified as Meadow Lake railway crossing; Buffalo Narrows ferry; India; and one unidentified mountain scene (possibly Banff).
- 7. University of Saskatchewan. 7 b&w photos, 1 colour photo. 1925, [ca. 1980s]. Interior and exterior images of the Diefenbaker Centre, probably given to May Beamish prior to the creation of a temporary "Kenderdine Gallery" in the Centre; 1 colour photo of Grant Devine turning the sod for the new Agriculture building, where the permanent Kenderdine Gallery was eventually located; an image of the College building ca. 1925 and a photo of [George Ling]. See also "Adelaide," above.
- [World War I]. [between 1914-1918?]. 9 b&w prints. A series of images, most of which were annotated in the same handwritting; showing a camp, people golfing or boating, and some scenery [in England]. Some individuals in these photos appear to be in uniforms ca. WWI.
