Biography:

Gens Douglas Hellquist was born in 1946 in North Battleford. He was a Canadian gay rights activist and publisher, most well-known for his prominent role in the formation of a cohesive LGBT community in Saskatoon, and Saskatchewan. Gens was a founding member of the Gay Liberation Front, which went on to become the Zodiac Friendship Society. These groups facilitated political lobbying for LGBT rights, as well as acted as an organizing body for social activities for the Saskatchewan LGBT community. The funds from these activities led to the creation of the Avenue C Community Centre in 1973 – the second gay community center in Canada. Hellquist was also involved in a number of prominent human rights cases, fighting against the distribution of hate speech, and promoting equality of gay and lesbian health care in Canada. In terms of his publishing work, Hellquist established and operated *Gaymates*, a penpal club that facilitated communications between gay men across Saskatchewan, Canada, the United States, and the world. He also established *Perceptions* in 1983, Saskatoon's first LGBT publication. Gens was also involved in LGBT health activism, being a founding member of Gay and Lesbian Health Services of Saskatoon, and the Canadian Rainbow Health Coalition, as well as serving on the boards of the Canadian AIDS Society and the Saskatchewan AIDS Network. Gens was awarded the Saskatchewan Centennial Medal in June 2005, and was inducted into the Queer Hall of Fame in 2010. He was also the first recipient of the Peter Corren Award for Outstanding Achievement.

Scope and Content:

This fonds includes materials related to Gens' work in bringing together Saskatchewan's gay community, both in general terms of his activism and gay health work, and more specifically in terms of his publishing work on *Gaymates* and *Perceptions*. The fonds also contains an extensive pornography collection ranging from magazines to videos to other types of pornographic materials. Gens maintained extensive subject files on Queer life in Canada, and these have been maintained under Series III: Queer Subject files. Many of these are related to the history of Queer communities in Canada and Saskatchewan. Finally, some personal material relating to Gens is also included.

Series I: Hellquist's Work

This series is meant to represent the bulk of Gens Hellquist's work with the gay community in Saskatoon. It has been divided into four subseries, representing his paid and volunteer work in general over the course of four decades, and then more specifically his work on the Gay Penpal publication Gaymates and the gay/lesbian newsmagazine Perceptions, as well as his work in the area of gay health.

A. General

This subseries represents a variety of work done by Gens Hellquist in the area of LGBT rights, including volunteer work on various celebration committees, his involvement in human rights cases, his work with Gay and Lesbian Support Services and similar groups, and his tenure with the Saskatoon Police Advisory Committee on Diversity. Not included here is his work with the publication of Gaymates and Perceptions, nor his work in the area of gay health, as these things will be addressed in later subseries.

Box 1

1. Celebration '90 Saskatoon – 1990. – **RESTRICTED**
The objects of "Celebration '90" - Saskatoon were to provide recreational and cultural activities for its members and to facilitate the formation of a team to represent Saskatoon at Celebration 90 – Gay Games III and Cultural Festival in Vancouver.
2. Censorship. – 1987.
Material from the Canadian Committee Against Customs Censorship (of lesbian and gay books, magazines, and videos) as well as the Right to Privacy Committee.
3. Coalition for Human Equality. – 1987 - 1989. – **RESTRICTED**
Meeting minutes, membership lists, press releases, and correspondence. Gens was not only a member of this coalition, but also worked with it through his involvement in *Perceptions*. A large part of his involvement was aimed towards implementing changes to Saskatchewan's Human Rights Code. File also includes a package on gay human rights.
4. Community Aid Resource Centre. – 1981 - 1984.
Gens worked for this group for some time. File includes general information about the organization, job descriptions, and benefits.
5. *Community Support Research Project: :Prepared by Crocus-Co-operative, Saskatoon Mental Health Association, Saskatoon Housing Coalition. – 1987*

8. Gay and Lesbian Support Services/ The Gay Times. – 1982.
 News bulletin about this organization of gay people working to provide services and programs to the gay community. In particular the group operated support phone lines in Saskatoon. This booklet was published alongside issues of *The Gay Times*, which contained news on Saskatoon’s gay scene.
9. Gay and Lesbian Support Services: Phone Volunteer Training.
 File on training for phone volunteer support training for the GLSS [Gay and Lesbian Support Services]. Workshop taught by Gens.
10. The Gay Organizer: A How-To Guide for Lesbians and Gay Men. – 1982.
 A binder produced by the Coalition for Gay Rights in Ontario and the Right to Privacy Committee as an aid to helping gay communities organize.

Correspondence between Hellquist, the Human rights commission, the Star Phoenix and multiple gay rights activists including Jeff Dodds, Jason Roy and Don Cochrane over the publication in the Star Phoenix of an anti-gay advertisement by Hugh Owens. Clippings related to same. Obituary for Robert Alan Short (Bob). See also file I.a.12 and I.a.11 above.

17. [Human Rights Case: Whatcott v. Komar, Wallace, Taylor and Hamre] – 2005, 2008.

This case is about anti-gay flyers having been distributed re:LGBTQ education in public schools. See also The Star Phoenix vs. Hellquist for similar case. See also I.a.13 above.

18. Lesbian and Pride Day Committee- 1994

Correspondence regarding complaint against the Saskatoon City Council, requesting that city employment be unbiased on the basis of sexual orientation, that the same benefit plans cover same-sex partners as

common-law partners, that the mayor and city council acknowledge that lesbians, gay men and bisexuals are valued and respected citizens of Saskatoon, that all companies or organizations doing business with the City of Saskatoon have non-discriminatory policies, that sensitivity training be provided, that a settlement of \$5000 be paid to Gay and Lesbian Health Services to address the effects of homophobia, and that the Gay Pride flag be flown from City Hall during Pride Week.

19. N. D. P. [New Democratic Party] – 1987.

Copy of *Neighbors in Need: Our Right to Security and Dignity, A Report on Social Services in Saskatchewan* and a document on Non-Government Organizations and the human service sector.

20. Phoenix Human Development Associates. – 1988-1990.

Another organization Hellquist was involved in which provided a variety of services and expertise on issues involving sexual orientation with an emphasis on human growth and development. This file includes correspondence regarding books on gay men and lesbians, a partnership with the Crocus co-operative, and fundraising information. File also includes informational brochures on the agency, the counselling services it offered, its job development program, and other counselling tools.

21. PLURA – 1987.

PLURA is a Presbyterian/Lutheran/United Church/Roman Catholic and Anglican association. In this file, the group is considering a proposed project by the Yorkton and area welfare rights committee, which had the objectives of public education, advocacy and service by and for people on welfare.

22. Redecision Therapy.

Redecision therapy is a combination of Transactional Analysis, Cognitive Therapy and Gestalt Therapy. It is a powerful way of resolving family of origin issues as well as internal conflicts. File includes Gens' notes and typewritten information on this type of therapy.

23. Saskatoon Police Advisory Committee on Diversity – 2004 - 2010

Gens Hellquist served on this committee formed to advise the Saskatoon Police Services on issues related to diversity, including recruitment and diversity training. File includes Saskatoon Police Service Recruitment Information, Saskatoon Police Service's Employment Equity Plan, interpreter form and list of interpreters, correspondence, notes on police cultural training and diversity awareness training and exam.

Peacekeepers Pedaling for Aboriginal People with Diabetes. File also includes a Certificate of Contribution.

24. *The Sheaf* vol. 69, no. 21. – 1978.

Featuring an article on the seizure in Toronto of the records of *The Body Politic*, a gay newspaper publication. See also the Neil Richards fonds.

25. Short Term Relationship Counselling: Planned Parenthood – 1977

A self instructional manual for use in family planning clinics.

26. Workshop: *Breaking Barriers: A Workshop and Facilitation Guide: Anti- Homophobia Workshop Development and Facilitation Training Manual.* – 2001.

27. Workshop: [Sex Workshop] – 1989.

A set of activities aimed at assisting class participants in feeling more comfortable when working with persons questioning their sexual orientation, and broadening knowledge regarding sexuality.

Pamphlet put together for a workshop for counsellors, therapists and other professionals on counselling gay men and lesbians.

29. The Zodiac Friendship Society / Gay Community Center of Saskatoon. – 1973-1975. -

Materials related to this group including meeting minutes, correspondence, by-laws and membership list. Gens Hellquist served as secretary of the group for many years. Also includes document: "A Brief Regarding the Saskatchewan Bill of Rights Act and Other Provincial Human Rights Acts Submitted to the Government of Saskatchewan and Members of the Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan."

B. Gaymates

Materials in this series relate to Gens Hellquist's work publishing Gaymates, a gay penpal/personals publication he compiled, edited, and managed from 1976 to 1993 under the business name Gay Services International. The publication served as a way for gay men from across the prairies, Canada, North America, and the globe to reach out to one-another in a safe, anonymous format.

Advertising materials used both to promote *Gaymates* and to find advertisements to feature in *Gaymates*. File includes information on subscriptions to gay travel services, notably the *Spartacus Club* which provided discounts to members at many gay-friendly businesses worldwide, a gay youth travel club, a Japanese exchange travel club, and

a pen-pal club based in Israel. Advertisements for legal support groups like the Prometheus foundation which aided those wrongfully accused of sexual misconduct with minors, and which facilitated a prison penpal club are also present. Samples of publications including *Cruise Weekly*; *Thunder Gay* (the gay publication of Thunder Bay); *The Vancouver Night Times* (1981) which features personals, articles on burlesque and sex culture and conspiracies; *Gay Horizons* (1979), a publication out of Calgary; *Justice Monthly* (See [Gay and Lesbian Publications]); *Making Waves: An Atlantic Quarterly for Lesbians and Gay Men* (1981); *Skipper's Mates*; *Troy*; *The Gay*; *Serendipity*, *The 18 Wheeler: The Newsletter of the American Truckhawk and Gay Truckers*, *The Newfoundland Herald* (1981) and *David* (1979). Some material in French. See also Series II. [Gay and Lesbian Publications]

2. *Body Politic*. – 1976 - 1985
Information on advertising for *Gaymates* in the *Body Politic*. Gens also worked as a news correspondent for this publication.
3. First Contact by *Gaymates* Names. – **RESTRICTED**

5. *Gaymates* Code System, lists of names.

6. *Gaymates* completed issues. – 1976-1993. – 3 folders
Two copies of every edition of *Gaymates* from its 1976 conception to the last issue in 1993.
7. *Gaymates* Information Bulletin
These small publications were created as a supplement to the larger *Gaymates* newsletter, serving to keep members updated between publications.
8. [*Gaymates* Loose Profiles] – 4 photographs
Folder of profiles submitted for the gay pen pal club *Gaymates* found loose in a box. Many appear to be duplicates of the more organized files following.
9. *Gaymates* Penpal Files - 1976-1994 – **RESTRICTED** – 125 photos and textual records.
These files provide valuable insight into on way in which gay men sought contact with one another pre-internet. Each subscriber has a file, which

includes a sexual and general profile of the subscriber, and a description of what he is looking for in a partner. Matchmaking correspondence between the subscriber, the publication, and potential matches is also included. Photographs of subscribers also occasionally appear—note some may contain nudity. Subscribers are generally from Canada, although there are some American and international correspondents as well (see key to the filing system below). Some of the newsletters also include a section for incarcerated correspondents. Although predominantly white males, multiple racial and ethnic backgrounds are represented throughout. Due to the sensitive nature of the content of these files, all files must be vetted by the archivist prior to use. Files have been organized according to *Gaymates* file numbers to maintain original order.

Perceptions was once the longest continuously published Gay and Lesbian newsmagazine in Canada, being published from 1983-2013.
