

MG 359 – Horace Beach fonds

Dates: 1945-[ca. 2002].

Extent: 30 cm of textual records.

Biography: Horace Dougald Beach was born on 12 March 1919 near Ernfold, Saskatchewan, and attended the University of Saskatchewan for two years prior to joining the Canadian armed forces. Following the war, he spent one year at the University of Edinburgh before returning to Canada and resuming his studies at the University of Saskatchewan. He was a Rhodes scholar. He worked in Newfoundland; and was director of counseling centers at Dalhousie University and later, at the University of Victoria. He died in Saskatoon on 2 October 2008.

Scope and content: This fonds contains materials relating to Beach's academic career and interests in psychology, human behaviour, and counseling; as well as material relating to World War II, conflict in general, and behaviour under various forms of stress.

Arrangement: This accrual is organized into a single alphabetical, subject-nominal listing.

Restrictions: There are no restrictions on access.

Counselling. - 1958-1983.

Also included is a "master list" of topics for his journal reprints.

Family Readings.

Functional Principles of Human Behaviour.

15 "chapters" on aspects of counselling, prepared by Beach.

Historical Geography – Professor Simpson Lectures, U of S. – 1945-1946.

Includes lecture notes; map of "human language species," and a catalogue of historical maps.

History and Media. 1941-2000.

Includes an essays written while at the U o f S: " 'Nature' and Nature with a Purpose" and "On Group Behavior, its relation to the voices which purport to speak for it, such as its leaders and newspapers;" together with clippings.

Marriage, Relationships and Sexuality.

Includes speech notes; text of a presentation to Grade 12 students; various articles by others, and clippings.

Moral Rearmament. – 1941-1961.

Includes copies of the New World News (June 1950-Feb 1951); Caux [France] Information Service: World Assembly for Moral Re-Armament; etc. Also includes two books: Buchman, Frank N.D. *Remaking the World*.
