MG 61: J.E. MURRAY COLLECTION

Biography: Walter Charles Murray was born 12 May 1866 in Studholm parish, King's county, New Brunswick. He began his academic career at the University of New Brunswick where he received a B.A. in 1886. After earning a grammar school license at the provincial Normal School, Murray went to the University of Edinburgh as the Canadian Gilchrist scholar and received a M.A. in philosophy in 1891. After a brief period of study in Berlin, Murray returned to his alma mater as Professor of Philosophy and Economics. Murray then settled in Halifax between 1892 and 1908 as the Munro professor of Philosophy and lecturer in Education at Dalhousie University. It was during this time that he married Christine Cameron, whom he had known since grade school, and subsequently they had three daughters. In 1908 he became the University of Saskatchewan's first President, a post he held until his retirement in 1937. In conjunction with his duties at the University of Saskatchewan, Murray served on a number of commissions, boards and councils. Upon his retirement he was named President Emeritus and remained active in the local community until his death in March, 1945.

Custodial History: This collection, bequeathed to the University of Saskatchewan, was accessioned in July 1981 and consists of 90 document boxes (9.5 meters). Over a period of many years, Dr. Jean Murray (Professor of History) fell heir to the private papers of her father, president W.C. Murray, her mother Christina and her sisters Christina and Dr. Lucy H. Murray (Professor of English, Regina College). It would appear she also acquired a number of items formerly the property of Drs. E. H. Oliver and A. S. Morton.

Scope and Content: This series contains personal and general correspondence, articles, addresses, journals, notes, minutes, reports, publications and clippings. The material pertains to the wide variety of activities and interests of W.C. Murray ranging from local and university to national and international concerns.

Arrangement: Although the collection had little internal organization when received, wherever possible the original order has been retained. An attempt has been made to rationalize the arrangement of the collection by separating it into distinct series, first by original owner and then by category within each unit. The major series are as follows:

- A. W. C. Murray
- B. (Mrs.) Christina Murray
- C. Christina Murray
- D. Lucy H. Murray
- E. Jean E. Murray

Two series merit particular attention: W.C. Murray and Jean E. Murray – Transcripts. The former consists of W.C. Murray's personal correspondence with family members, general correspondence, name and subject files and commissionerships. These items were created and/or received during his career prior to and during his term as President of the University of Saskatchewan (1908-1937). The latter unit (Jean E. Murray – Transcripts) consists of typescripts, transcripts, carbon copies and some originals of W.C. Murray's presidential correspondence as well as notes gathered from other record and manuscript collections. Both these series should be consulted in conjunction with RG 1 S1 (Presidential Papers: Series 1) and MGI (W.C. Murray Papers). It would appear that in many instances files in the Jean E. Murray collection not only supplement but also originally were an integral part of these record groups.

Biography: Christina Cameron was born in Fredericton, New Brunswick in 1866. Miss Cameron enrolled in the honours course in English, French and German at the University of New Brunswick in 1890 and graduated four years later, winning the Alumni Gold Medal as the most distinguished student in classics. She next attended Normal School and subsequently accepted a teaching post in its Model School. In 1895 she married W.C. Murray who had been a former classmate in high school. The couple settled in Halifax for the next fourteen years. In 1909 Christina Murray brought her household, including three daughters, west to join Dr. Murray in Saskatoon where he had accepted the post of the first President of the newly created University of Saskatchewan. Over the next four decades Mrs. Murray was to maintain and active role in both the university and the local community serving on the executive of a number of organizations. In honour of her many years of service the University of Saskatchewan granted her a LL.D in 1938. She died on 4 July 1947.

Scope and Content: This series contains personal correspondence, biographical material, clippings and subject files on a variety of topics including the National Council of Women, Saskatchewan Grain Growers Association (Women's Section), and the YWCA. She attended the University of Saskatchewan, earning both a B.A. (1922) and a M.A. (1923). She continued her postgraduate education, earning a second M.A. from the University of Toronto (1924) and a Ph.D. from the University of Chicago (1936). After working at the University of Alberta, Jean Murray joined the University of Saskatchewan as an Instructor in History in 1931, and gradually rose through the ranks, becoming Full Professor in 1966. At her retirement in 1968 she was awarded the rank of Professor Emeritus of History. Dr. Murray died on 1981.
