

MG 93- J. Howard Richards fonds

Biography: Dr. J. Howard Richards was born in 1916 in Caerphilly Wales. He earned his B.SC with Honors in 1938 at the University of Wales in Aberystwyth. He worked briefly as a Geography teacher in Penorth, Wales in 1939, and moved to Canada in the early 1940's. During the war, he served with the Canadian army for four years, from 1942 to 1946, and upon his return obtained his M.A. from the University of Toronto in 1947. During his studies, from 1946 to 1947, he worked as a teaching fellow in the Department of Geography at the University of Toronto, and by 1948 had achieved the title of Sessional Lecturer. From 1948 to 1951, Dr. Richards worked as an instructor at Utica College at Syracuse University, and from 1951-1953 he was an Assistant Professor at the University of Manitoba. Towards the end of 1953, Richards returned to the University of Toronto this time as a lecturer, a position he held there from 1953-1956. In 1954, while at the University of Toronto, Richards obtained his Ph. D. From 1956 to 1960, he worked as an Assistant and Associate Professor at the Royal Military College of Canada in Kingston, Ontario. In 1960, Dr. Richards was hired as a professor of Geography at the University of Saskatchewan, a position he would hold for nearly two decades, until his retirement in 1979. During this period, he also acted as the Head of the Department of Geography. His contributions to the study of Saskatchewan geography are extensive, and the Atlas of Saskatchewan, of which he was editor, was highly acclaimed (published 1969, when he was Department Head). This was the first comprehensive atlas of Saskatchewan geography produced, and took four years to complete. Richards is also well known for his work in regional and urban planning, and in fact he (along with John G. McConnell) started Regional and Urban Planning Program at the University of Saskatchewan in 1968. He passed away in 2003.

Scope and Content: Material consists largely of Richards' correspondence, lecture materials, and writing, as well as the writing and research of his peers. His work on the *Atlas of Saskatchewan* is included, as his a variety of research material from studies done on an array of topics including recreation and national parks, NASA, land use, and grasslands.

Restrictions: Files marked as **RESTRICTED** require vetting by the archivist prior to release. All restrictions are applied as per privacy legislation. Copyright restrictions also apply.
