

MG 749 - Margaret "Pearl" Hanning fonds

Dates: ca.1890s-1982 (inclusive); 1935-1982 (predominant)

Extent: .44 m textual material; 32 photographs; artifacts

Biography: Margaret "Pearl" Ruphina Hanning was born in Souris, P.E.I. and came west around 1902 with her mother and two aunts. She attended the University of Saskatchewan and attained a B.A. in 1915 (in the same graduating class as notable alums Nan KcKay and John Diefenbaker). After teaching for a while in the province she then obtained her Masters in French and Education from the University of Madison Wisconsin. She then joined the staff at Scott Collegiate in 1943, moving on to teach French at Marian High School, and then joined the Campion College at the University of Regina where she worked until she retired. She passed away July 11, 1982.

Scope and content: This fonds contains materials collected and created by Margaret "Pearl" Hanning throughout her life. Predominant are publications by R.W. Robins*, a British collector and author she had a correspondence with. Some correspondence, poems, and pamphlets were found tucked inside these publications. Also are some artifacts relating to the British monarchy and her retirement. Other documents pertaining to her life are also present such as photographs, school work, and her burial certificate.

*F.W. Robins, according to the British Museum "Dilettante, collector and author ('The Story of the Lamp', OUP, 1939); Fellow of the RGS, member of Museums Association and Egypt Exploration Society, etc. Bequeathed lamps to the BM."

Arrangement: This fonds has been arranged alphabetically by subject.

Custodial history: This fonds was donated to the archives by Marcel & Debbie Nussbaum, who found the material while they were dealing with Norah Gilles Huland's estate. Norah was a life-long friend of Pearl Hanning. Norah's name is on the burial documents included in this fond, and is named in Pearl's obituary.

Restrictions: There are no restrictions on access.

With misc. prayer cards tucked inside, left where they were found. End papers are covered in handwritten notes (prayers?).

Unsigned, unattributed.

19. Photographs. – ca.1890s-1971. – 30 photographs.

Photographs mainly of Margaret "Pearl" Hanning. Notably featuring Pearl driving an ostrich cart, sitting on car, with horses, with dogs, staff photo, USask graduation photo (1915), formal portraits (especially Pearl with her parents as a child), school photo strip containing 8 copies of same image; etc. Also included is a handwritten name tag and a Canadian Federation of University Women membership card.

English essays, French vocabulary, etc. done by Hanning.

21. The Smith: The Traditions and Lore of an Ancient Craft by F.W. Robbins, 1953.

Published hardcover copy. Annotated "with sincere regards, FW Robins, 1954" Tucked inside the book was "Lectures, F.W. Robins, F.R.G.S", a pamphlet containing a list of his lectures.

22. The Story of the Lamp (and the Candle) by F.W. Robins. — 1939-52. — 2 folders.

Folder 1: Copy of *The Story of the Lamp (and the Candle)* published 1939. Annotated "With sincere regards F.W. Robins".

Folder 2: (Items found tucked inside this book)

- Letter dated July 7, 1955 [Date really looks like 1935 at first glance but that doesn't make sense in context] to Miss Hanning from F.W. Robins. Letter discusses cruise in Norway, and giving Miss Hanning the book "The Lamp" and "Finger Points". Signature looks like it could be the same person as the poems.
- Typed letter dated Dec 16, 1935 from F.W. Robins to Miss Hanning. Discusses the political climate of the time thinks Britain should be friends with Germany, not France, sympathizes with Italy, thinks the war will blow over.
- Torn newspaper clipping with "The Lamp" short story, 1934.
- 23. The Story of Water Supply by F.W. Robins. 1946-1947.

Published hardcover copy. "Pearl Hanning" written inside the front cover and on title page it is annotated "with kind regards FW Robins Jan 20, 1947.

24. Who's Who in Saskatchewan, 1969.

Contains an entry for Margaret Hanning.

Tucked inside:

-"Who's who" card with congratulatory note and newspaper clipping about Miss Hanning being elected president of the Regina Business and Professional women's Club.
