Biographical history

Mildred Hendrum Russell was born in 1912 in Lancer, Saskatchewan. She was married to T.L. “Ted” Johnson until his death in 1963. They had had two sons, Brian and another who died in infancy. Brian died in 1994.

Mildred later married John Carson “Jack” Russell in 1969. John was a widowed farmer, and they lived at 1309 Grace Street in Moose Jaw according to the 1970 Henderson’s Directory.

Mildred was a volunteer of the Parson’s Pantry of St. Andrew’s Church. She was in this role when she met Lieutenant-Governor George Porteous in person.

She published a book of poems titled “Reflections of Life” in 1974.

John died July 25, 2002. Mildred died May 21, 2003.
