MG 5 - R.J.G. Bateman fonds

Dates: [ca. 1909-before 1914], 1922 (inclusive).

Extent: .12 m of textual records.

Biography: Reginald Bateman was born in 1884 at Co. Kerry, Ireland. He received his early education at Royal School in Enniskillen Co. Fermanagh. He entered Trinity College in 1902 and graduated with a B.A. in 1906 and an M.A. in 1909. Shortly after graduation, he left for Canada and was hired as the first Professor of English at the University of Saskatchewan in 1909. Bateman enlisted in September 1914 and had a distinguished army career. He was killed in action in France on 3 September 1918.

Scope and content: This fonds contains records relating to teaching, including notes for lectures, and student records and marks. Following Bateman's death, the University published a memorial volume of his writing, including some poems, lectures, essays (among them, on war), and correspondence.

Restrictions: There are no restrictions on access.
