

MG 464 - Robin Maugham fonds

Dates: 1967-1981 (inclusive)

Extent: 0.2 m textual records.

Biography: Robert (Robin) Cecil Romer Maugham was born on May 17, 1916 in London, England to Viscount Frederic Herbert, a judge and Lord Chancellor of England, and Helen Mary Maugham (nee Romer). Originally trained in law at Eton and Trinity Hall, Cambridge, Maugham gave up his career as a barrister after he was wounded while serving in the Western Desert campaign during World War Two. While recovering from his wounds, he wrote his first book, *Come to Dust*, and decided to become a writer full-time. He was the author of novels, plays, film scripts and non-fiction books, including two books of reminiscences about his uncle, Somerset Maugham. Much of Maugham's work is related to themes of homosexuality. A new novel, *The Deserters*, was in press at the time of his death. Maugham died on March 13, 1981 in Brighton, England after a long illness.

Custodial History: This material was originally acquired, arranged, and catalogued by the Special Collections department of the University of Saskatchewan Library for the manuscript collection. It was transferred to the University Archives in 2013.

Scope and Content: This fonds consists of a small portion of Maugham's manuscript and published items. The majority of the material relates to *The Deserters* and includes manuscripts, proofs and a published copy of this work. The incident which forms the central theme of *The Deserters* is a meeting between an English and German soldier during World War Two. This incident is based on an event that happened to Maugham while he was fighting in the Western Desert during World War Two.

The fonds also includes heavily annotated manuscripts of *Winter in Ischia: A Novel* and *The Account: A Novel*. The Account: A Novel was based on Maugham's play Enemy. There is also a manuscript of the play, A Question of Retreat. The fonds also includes a first printing paperback copy of The Wrong People, a monograph which was originally published by Maugham under the pseudonym David Griffin. The fonds includes a handwritten note and published tribute written by Peter Burton, who worked closely with Maugham for many years and was one of his literary executors. The fonds also contains newspaper clippings.

Arrangement: This material was originally acquired by the Special Collections department and was arranged and numbered by the librarian at the time of acquisition. The original numbering scheme has been left intact to facilitate listings in the University of Saskatchewan Library catalogue for retrieval of this material. The fonds has been arranged into the following series:
