Extent: 5.20 m of textual records, photographs, memorabilia.

Administrative history: The USSU Women's Centre began in the early 1970's as a place for women to gather with other women in a safe space, as well as access information on a variety of topics such as "abortion referral, auto services, birth control, day care, financial aid, legal aid, self-defence, single parents, travel assistance, vasectomy" and many more. The first few decades of the Women's Centre were full of upheavals as in 1983 the USSU voted to rescind the status groups status in 1983 due to it being "too political, [that it] unnecessarily excluded men, and did not provide enough service". USSU implemented assessments for the 1984/85 academic year to understand what the student body wanted to see in their Women's Centre. A temporary Women's Service was run in 1985 to cover the gap during the assessment. Further upheaval came in 1990 when the USC:

...announced that it was going to drastically alter the way the Women's Centre is run. Instead of allowing the volunteers to choose their own directors, as is the practice at most women's centres around the country, the USC has decided to impose its own director. The reasons for this decision are not entirely clear. The USC maintains that the volunteer collective violated its constitution. Yet even if the accusations are true, these violations hardly seem to warrant the wholesale change put for the the USC. – Mark Scrivens, *Sheaf*, Oct 11/90

Letters supporting the USSU Women's Centre's right to choose their own director poured in from sister associations from across Canada. By 1991 these issues appeared to be ironed out, as the USSU Women's Policy, October 1991 maintained its autonomy as a collective in regard to programming and choosing its directors. The necessary reporting to the USSU was well defined in this policy. As of 2018 their webpage states:

The Women's Centre is a safe, dynamic, comfortable, positive space to organize around feminism and activism. It serves as a resource and information centre, with a large library of feminist titles. There's a lounge to hang out in and meet like-minded people. It is a place of inspiration, enlightenment, and encouragement. We are a pro-choice organization and recognize the strengths of the diverse and vibrant community at the U of S and Saskatoon.

Scope and content: This fonds contains material related to the administration, programming, and information services of the USSU Women's Centre in its various incarnations.
