Dear Dr. Wheeler,

With regard to your five acre Plot No. 3 of Marquis wheat presented to this Association for registration in the status of elite, I have been instructed by the Committee on Registration of hand selected seed stocks to bring to your attention the fact that the acreage exceeds that allowed by regulation. The Committee has spent considerable time in dealing with this matter in an attempt to impose the least possible hardship upon growers, and has recommended to the Association that the stocks in question be recognized in the status of 1st generation. In this connection please refer to Section 5, Sub-Section C, Page 6, Circular 12, and also to the C.S.G.A. 1928-1929 Annual Report, page 43, Section 1B. It will be noted that the regulations as amended at the annual convention at Winnipeg in 1929 specifically state that the area devoted to elite in the hands of any one grower must not exceed Where mass selection is practiced three acres. as the method of producing hand selected stocks for registration, the area to be devoted to this method in any one year may not exceed one acre.

Should you have any comments to offer, we shall be very glad to receive them and they should reach us not later than March 2, 1931.
